Ambitious plans for a new ground-breaking learning centre in Brecon have been supported by the Welsh Government.

Powys County Council and NPTC Group of Colleges submitted a 'strategic outline case' for the Beacons Learning Campus, a £55m development to provide 11-16 secondary education, a sixth form academy, vocational college and pupil referral unit.
